



### Events and Panels Policy

All events held with open admission will be required to maintain at the most a PG-13 level of language and topics.

Any events or panels wishing to be a more mature topic must have a closed door ID checking policy, must be cleared by the events Director, and If requested, may only be held with the events director in attendance.

All events and panels will be submitted on the appropriate forms to the events director 1 month prior to the convention. All panelists and event leaders will submit contact information, a summary of the topic, and any and all required materials at that time. Changes can be made after that date but must be cleared by the events director. The Panelist will be required to hold legal identification Information on file with the convention for legal purposes.

Short notice openings or unused rooms may be used for panels and events with 1 hour+ notification and agreement of the events director. A similar form will need to be filled out at that time and kept on file.

Due to hotel policies and state laws, as well as restrictions made by the Rocky mountain Fur Con staff, Any mess created by a panel is to be reasonably cleaned up at the end of the panel, and that all possible precautions are to be taken to avoid permanent damage to any hotel property or equipment. Failure to do so may result in actions taken against the panelist if the damage is deemed fault by negligence.

Actions taken by attending members of the convention are not held liable by the panelist, and any incidents that occur should be reported to convention staff members as soon as possible to be taken care of.

There is no alcohol, non-prescription drugs, explosives, firearms, or weapons allowed in the convention area, thus by extension not allowed in Events or panels held within convention space. No Events occurring inside of convention space are allowed to contain these things without express exception of convention core staff members. Any events or panels being conducted involving these items held outside the convention space are not sanctioned by Rocky Mountain Fur Con or Mid American Anthropomorphic and Arts Corporation and said organizations are not responsible for these events.

Rocky Mountain Fur Convention does not currently offer free admission to panelists. Panelists may earn their panel time as hours toward the standard gifts given to volunteers as a 1:1 ratio of hours. More complicated events, or events which a panelist provides equipment may be compensated at higher rates.
